

Except for specified courses, credit may be received only once for each course.

GE COLUMN EXPLANATION

The Arizona Board of Regents and the State Community College Board have agreed to three transfer general education programs. The purpose of the agreement is to ensure that when students complete their GE (general education) requirements at EAC they will be able to transfer to an Arizona public university without loss of credits. The three transfer general education programs are the Arizona General Education Curriculum, Associate of Arts (AGEC-A), the Arizona General Education Curriculum, Associate of Business (AGEC-B), and the Arizona General Education Curriculum, Associate of Science (AGEC-S). Eastern Arizona College has established general education programs satisfying each of the three AGEC's.

If a student is enrolled in one of these programs at EAC that meets the requirements for the AGEC-A, B or S and has had a graduation check completed during their last semester of enrollment, the message "Arizona General Education Curriculum-A, B or S in Progress" will be stated at the bottom of the transcript. An "A, B or S will appear under the

new "GF" column to note which classes in used to satisfy an C-A, B or S requirement.
